This handbook describes policies and procedures for undergraduate and graduate voice students at the University of Central Florida in Orlando. UCF's Voice area reserves the right to change the policies, procedures, rules, regulations, and information in this handbook at any time. Changes will become effective at the time the proper authorities so determine and the changes will apply to both prospective students and those already enrolled. This handbook is a general information publication only, and is not intended to nor does it contain all regulations that relate to students in the UCF School of Performing Arts.

Applied Study Guidelines

a) Undergraduate music majors with voice as their principal instrument must complete the following amount of applied study as per their curriculum requirements:

Bachelor of Arts: - total of 4 credit hours

MVV 1873 (4 semesters = 4 credit hours) or MVV 1411 (2 semesters = 4 credit hours)

Bachelor of Music Education: - total of 12 credit hours

MVV 1411 (2 semesters = 4 credit hours) MVV 2421 (2 semesters = 4 credit hours) MVV 3431 (2 semesters = 4 credit hours)

Bachelor of Music [Voice Performance] - total of 22 credit hours

MVV 1411 (2 semesters = 4 credit hours)

MVV 2421 (2 semesters = 4 credit hours)

MVV 3431 (2 semesters = 6 credit hours)

MVV 4441 (2 semesters = 8 credit hours)

Additional study beyond degree requirements may be allowed only with special permission from both the department chair and studio teacher.

- b) Graduate music majors with voice as their principal instrument should consult with the Graduate Music Advisor concerning the amount of applied voice study required/recommended for the degree.
- c) Undergraduate students are expected to be enrolled in a major choral ensemble each semester in which they are enrolled in applied lessons.
- d) Students are expected to pay for a pianist for lessons, forum, juries and recitals, as per studio policy.
- e) Proper attire is expected at forum, jury and recital performances.
- f) Undergraduate students are expected to attend all UCF voice faculty recitals, as well as all voice related Thursday forums and Tuesday voice area recitals.

Failure to meet these expectations will result in a lowering of a student's applied study semester grade.

Studio Placement

Once a student has been admitted to the Music Department and University, he or she may request to study with a particular teacher. Every effort will be made to honor this request but there is no guarantee of placement in the student's choice. Much of the studio placement process hinges on the number of studio slots available for each applied teacher.

Changing Voice Studios

If a student wishes to change to another studio, the procedure is as follows:

- a) The student must first speak to his/her current voice teacher about his/her concerns.
- b) The student must then speak with the Voice Area Coordinator, who will offer counsel and act as a mediator if conflict arises. If the student's teacher is the Voice Area Coordinator, he/she may choose to speak with the Chair of the Music Department.

Note: In our profession it is considered unethical to study voice with more than one teacher concurrently. In support of this position, the Voice Area prohibits any student taking voice instruction for credit at UCF from studying with any other teacher on or off campus.

Note: The UCF Voice faculty members abide by the National Association of Teachers of Singing code of ethics, as found at the NATSwebsite

Audition for a Change of Degree Program

Any student wishing to change degree programs may audition for the Voice Faculty at the end of any semester. Since regular end-of-semester juries serve as assessment tools for the students' work for the current semester under the students' current degree path, change of degree hearings are treated separately from that student's jury. Students interested in considering such a change are encouraged to speak with their applied teacher and to the voice area coordinator concerning additional applicable requirements (such as meeting repertoire minimums, etc.).

MVV 1873(a) - 1 selection; any language

MVV 1873(b) - 1 selection; Italian

MVV 1873(c & d) – 2 selections; 1 must be German or French

MVV 1411(a & b) - 4 selections; 2 English and 2 Italian

Bachelor of Music Education:

MVV 1411(a & b) – 4 selections; 2 English and 2 Italian

MVV 2421(a & b) – 5 selections; 3 German and 2 @ teacher's discretion MVV 3431(a & b) – 6 selections; 3 French and 3 @ teacher's discretion

Overall BME minimum repertoire requirements; 8 Italian songs, 8 German songs, 6 French songs, 1 recitative, 1 aria, 1 musical theatre selection

Bachelor of Music [Voice Performance]

MVV 1411(a & b) – 4 selections; 2 English and 2 Italian

MVV 2421(a & b) – 5 selections; 3 German and 2 @ teacher's discretion

MVV 3431(a & b) – 6 selections; 3 French and 3 @ teacher's discretion

MVV 4441(a & b) – 7 selections; all @ teacher's discretion Overall BM minimum repertoire requirements = 8 Italian songs, 8 German songs,

8 French songs, 1 recitative, 3 arias (oratorio or opera)

Master of Arts in Music:

MVV 5451/6452 – 2 selections; at teacher's discretion

Note: Additional repertoire beyond these minimum requirements may be expected or required by the studio teacher.

Note: Oratorio arias need not be memorized but will also not count toward minimum repertoire requirement.

Juries

- a) Every student enrolled in applied voice must sing a jury at the end of each semester.*
- b) Students must bring the following forms to each jury:
 - 1.) Four (4) completed copies of the <u>Voice Jury Sheet</u>
 - 2.) One (1) completed copy of the Voice Promotion Exam Sheet
 - 3.) One (1) copy of a cumulative repertoire list. The list should be organized by year and include song/aria titles, composers and whether or not each selection was memorized for presentation in a jury.
- c) In most cases, BME and BM students will perform two selections from their repertoire list in the jury, the first of which is their choice; the second will be selected by a faculty member. Students enrolled in MVV 1873 need only perform one selection.
- d) Repertoire may not be repeated from previous juries.
- Failure to meet the minimum repertoire requirements will result in the lowering of the applied voice grade.
- f) If a student is unable to sing a jury because of illness, he/she must present a doctor's excuse. An incomplete will be recorded as that student's semester grade, and the student must arrange a make-up jury with the full voice faculty present within the first two weeks of the following semester.
- g) In the semester of a degree required recital, students must still sing a jury and meet the same minimum repertoire requirement suitable to that semester of study. Students will receive their jury during the recital hearing.
- h) Students who have completed their minimum degree requirements for applied study need not adhere to repertoire requirements

Upper Divisional Exam

- a) An Upper Divisional Exam [UDE] is required of all BM and BME voice students in the final jury of their MVV 2421 level applied voice study prior to enrollment in MVV 3414.
- b) UDE applicants must sign up for two consecutive jury time slots at the end of semester juries.
- c) Exams will consist of singing three or more selections from their jury sheet listing, a music sight-reading exam, and recitation of Italian and German texts chosen by the faculty.
- d) Students must also present one copy of a literal translation for each foreign language selection listed as prepared for this jury. Faculty members will quiz the student as to the meanings of one or more of those songs, expecting enough detail to assure the faculty that the student knows hat he/she is singing in those selections at all times.

- e) Voice faculty present at the jury will vote pass/fail for each student.
- f) Should a student fail the UDE, he/she will be required to re-enroll in MVV 2421, and will be given one more opportunity to pass it before being removed from their degree track.

Recitals

- a) BME students will perform a Junior (30 minutes of music) recital and BM students will perform a Junior and Senior (45 minutes of music) recital. MA students choosing the recital performance track will perform a recital with a minimum of 45 minutes of music. Other options available to MA students include a written thesis paper or a "lecture recital" which would likely include less sung material than a traditional recital. Please see the Graduate Music Advisor for more details.
- b) Repertoire for recitals is at the discretion of the studio teacher, but should reflect the progressive repertoire requirements outlined above through a variety of languages, styles, musical time periods, and genre.

Recital Hearings

As stated in the department's student handbook:

- a) Students must complete and submit to their applied music teacher the RecitalHearingApprovalForm (available in the Music office). This document must be signed by the student's applied voice teacher and accompanist at least two (2) weeks before a recital hearing.
- b) A Recital Hearing must be heard by a faculty committee 14–21 days before the scheduled recital date. The student must be prepared to perform the entire recital if asked by the committee.
- c) It is the student's responsibility to schedule the Recital Hearing with the faculty committee [which must be made up of at least three music faculty, one of whom must be the applied voice teacher and at least two of whom must be full-time music faculty].
- d) All assisting performers must participate for the Recital Hearing to be approved.
- e) The scheduled recital date will remain tentative until after this hearing, when the program will either be approved or not approved for presentation to the public.
- f) If the student does not pass the hearing, the student may be allowed to re-apply for a second hearing. In the case of a second failed hearing, the student will have to re-apply in the next semester.

Degree-Specific Course Planning

Some voice specific courses required for completion of our music degrees cannot be offered each semester or even each year. Students are responsible to meet with their music advisor to map out a plan of when to take each of the required courses. Failure to take one of these courses when offered can delay graduation by as much as three semesters. Below is a grid which shows when these classes are scheduled to be offered [subject to change]:

Admission Requirements

Admission Requirements - Music Education

- Audition. To be accepted in to Music Education, a student must demonstrate advanced proficiency by performing compositions representing a variety of musical periods (baroque, classical, romantic, contemporary).
- Memorization is required for pianists and vocalists.
- Accompanists are provided for vocalists only.
- Each candidate must bring his/her own audition music.
- The department will only provide large instruments such as a tuba, string, bass, or timpani for these auditions.
- The audition will serve as a placement exam for accepted candidates.
- Refer to the UCF Music Department website for specific audition requirements.
- Prior to attending the first music class as a music major at UCF, all students will take a keyboard placement examination to determine the appropriate level of class piano.
- Interview. In addition to a performance audition, students must successfully complete an interview with Music Education faculty.

Admission Requirements - Professional Program

- Application into the Professional Program must be made at the conclusion of 45 hours of course work. Students must complete a formal application for the Professional Program. (Deadlines: February 15 for Fall semester admission and September 15 for Spring semester admission). Transfers may be admitted on an individual basis at the discretion of the Music Education faculty. To apply for the Music Education Professional Program, students must:
- Complete 45 hours of coursework including: 15 hours of General Education Program courses, EDF 2005, MUT 2126, first semester of Performance II.
- Have a minimum overall GPA of 2.5 and a grade of "C" (2.0) or better in each performance, education, and music education course.
- Have on file in the University admissions office passing scores on the General Knowledge Test of the Florida Teacher Competency Examination.
- Provide satisfactory documentation and reflection on 15 hours of field experiences (See Music Education Coordinator for more information).

To be accepted into the Music Education Professional Program students must:

- Demonstrate proficiency with aural skills (including the ability to match pitch with the voice) and communication skills (including the ability to write and speak effectively).
- Complete MVK 2122, MUT 2127, and two semesters of Performance II.

Notes:

- (1) Students may not enroll in Performance III or Professional Program courses unless all requirements for admission are satisfied.
- (2) Students who change degree programs and select this major must adopt the most current catalog.

■ (3) Common program prerequisites are subject to revision based on changes Section 1004.04, Florida Statutes, Public Accountability and State Approval for Teacher Preparation Programs, and State Board of Education Rule 6A-5.5.066, Approval of Pre-service Teacher Preparation Programs.

- Have on file passing scores on all 4 parts of the Florida Teacher Certification General Knowledge Test (no alternatives or waivers will be accepted).
- Possess minimum overall GPA of 2.5
- Possess minimum specialization GPA of 2.5
- Achieve a "C" or better in all prerequisite methods/ specialization courses
- Complete a formal application for Internship I online (Deadlines: February 15 for fall semester and September 15 for spring semester).
- Current enrollment in or completion of Performance III (first semester).
- Completion of Music Education prerequisites and Education Core Requirements.
- Completion of 30 semester hours of General Education and Common Program courses.
- Completion of all Specialty Area courses except Secondary Methods II (MUE 433X), Seminar in Music Teaching (MUE 4394) and Internship II (ESE 4943).
- Possess minimum professional preparation GPA of 2.5.
- Internship I: Students are assigned to a school with certified Supervising Teachers under the direction of a University Coordinator. During the semester, students spend two full days per week (Tuesday and Thursday) in assigned schools with half the time in an Elementary setting and half in a Secondary school setting. Students are expected to provide their own transportation to assigned locations.

Admission to Internship II will be granted to students who meet the following requirements:

- Completion of all admission requirements for Internship I (see above).
- Completion of Performance III and any associated recital (students may not perform a recital during Internship II).
- Completion of all music methods and techniques courses.
- Completion of all General Education and Common Program courses.
- Internship II: Students are assigned to a school with certified Supervising Teachers under the direction of a University Coordinator five days a week for the entire semester, normally during the student's last semester. Students are permitted to enroll in other classes only with the consent of the departmental advisor. Students are expected to provide their own transportation to assigned locations

Special Non-Course Requirements

- Note: Contact the Music Education Advisor for details.
- Students should register to take the General Knowledge Test of the Florida Teaching Certification Examination (FTCE) before the third semester of enrollment at UCF. (See http://www.fl.nesinc.com/ for test information).
- Electronic Portfolio. Students will develop an electronic portfolio while enrolled in upper division education courses and internship. The portfolio requires demonstration of professional growth, reflection, and proficiency in the 12 Florida Educator Accomplished Practices. Consult with the Music Education Advisor for specific information regarding portfolio construction.

Ensemble Participation

- Selected from University Chorus, Women's Chorus, Symphony Orchestra, Concert Band, and Wind Ensemble. Four hours of Jazz Lab or one hour of Marching Band may be used to fulfill Major Ensemble requirements.
- Students whose primary instrument is a wind instrument must audition for Wind Ensemble whenever it is offered.
- Ensemble assignment is by the Ensemble directors in consultation with the applied faculty.
- Transfer students must take Major Ensemble during each of their remaining semesters, except when enrolled in Internship II
- Native UCF students must take each Major Ensemble credit in separate semesters.
- Students enrolled in a Performance course must concurrently enrolled in an appropriate major ensemble if accepted.

Recitals

■ Students must complete a faculty-approved public recital (optional for students in the Elementary School Music Specialization). Recitals are normally performed while concurrently enrolled in the second semester of Performance III.

CMENC Membership

■ Active participation in CMENC is expected. Students are expected to maintain a record of participation at CMENC events. In addition, students are expected to document attendance at any event that promotes development as a music educator (e.g., music or music education conferences, workshops).

 Attendance at all Music Education Forums (except during Internship I and II) is expected

■ Students are expected to be in K-12 schools each semester. Prior to internship experiences, students are expected to observe, assist, and teach in variety of grade levels and settings (e.g., urban, suburban, general, choral, instrumental). Students are expected to maintain a record of and reflections on all field experiences as this will be required for the Music Education Proficiency Examination.
